The purpose of this course is to prepare and perform representative works of Jazz and Contemporary instrumental literature. The works will primarily focus on 20<sup>th</sup> Century jazz compositions. The study of jazz history and improvisation would be essential to the preparation of the music.

  - d. Raggae (Bob Marley, Jimmy Cliff, Wailing Souls, etc.)
- D. 60s jazz
  - a. Bop (Charlie Parker, John Coltrane, Thelonius Monk, etc.)
  - b. Cool (Miles Davis, Freddie Hubbard, Bill Evans, etc.)
- E. Funk (Herbie Hancock, Sly & the Family Stone, Temptations, etc.)
