A combination of current scripting/programming languages and web page authoring software will be utilized for topics such as: building, formatting, enhancing, and publishing pages; maintaining a website; creating and manipulating graphics; and incorporating style sheets, JavaScript, or Java Applets. Each student will create, publish, and manage a website dealing with a topic of global/international interest.
